3. The CS Leveraged Loan Index is designed to mirror the investible universe of the \$US-denominated leveraged loan market. Loans are added to the index upon issuance according to the following criteria: (1) Loans must be rated "5B" or lower. That is, the highest Moody's/S&P ratings in the index are Baa1/BB+ or Ba1/BBB+. If unrated, the initial spread level must be Libor plus 125 basis points or higher. (2) Only funded term loans are included. (3) The tenure must be at least one year.

5. Source: FactSet Portfolio Analytics. "Average Coupon" is the weighted average annual coupon for the performing securities in the Fund. "Yield-to-Worst" is the lowest potential yield that can be received on a bond without the issuer actually defaulting. Yield-to-Worst is calculated on the performing securities in the Fund. Securities are capped at a maximum 25% Yield-to-Worst. "Duration" is a measure of the sensitivity of the price of a fixed-income investment to a change in interest rates.
